

SPOTS ARE ALWAYS CHIC

a beginner can make this jumper

THE jumper you see on the cover is in light blue with navy spots, and very attractive it looks . . . but navy embroidered with white, beige with brown, pink with brown, would all be good, too. The wool used has a bouclé finish.

MATERIALS: 10 ozs. Paton's Super Bouclé, blue, No. 1244, 1 oz. Paton's Super Crêpe, navy, No. 2204. A pair No. 12 and a pair No. 10 "Beehive" needles.

MEASUREMENTS: To fit 32-34-inch bust; length from top of shoulder, 19½ inches; sleeve seam, 18½ inches.

TENSION: 7 stitches to an inch measured over stocking-stitch.

BACK

With No. 12 needles, cast on 100 stitches and work 4 inches in k. 1, p. 1 rib. Change to No. 10 needles and work in stocking-stitch for 1 inch. Now increase at each end of next and every

following 16th row until there are 110 stitches on the needle. Carry on straight until work measures 13½ inches from commencement.

Here shape for armholes, at the same time changing to k. 1, p. 1 rib. Cast off 6 stitches at beginning of next 2 rows, then k. 2 tog. at beginning of next 18 rows.

Carry on straight in rib until work measures 19 inches from commencement. Here shape shoulders. Cast off 7 stitches at beginning of next 6 rows. Cast off remainder.

FRONT

Work exactly as for back to end of armhole decreases. **NEXT ROW:** Rib 40, putting remaining stitches on a spare needle. Work straight on these 40 stitches for 1¾ inches, ending at neck edge. Continue thus:—**1ST ROW:** Cast off 9, rib to end. **2ND ROW:** Rib. **3RD ROW:** k. 2 tog., rib to end. Repeat these last 2 rows until 21 stitches remain. Cast off 7 stitches at

beginning of next 3 rows at armhole edge.

Work remaining 40 stitches to correspond.

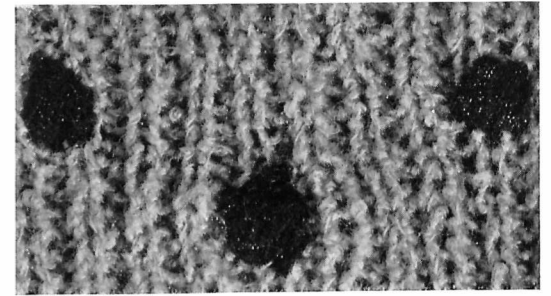
SLEEVES

With No. 12 needles cast on 60 stitches and work 4 inches in k. 1, p. 1 rib. Change to No. 10 needles and work straight for 3 inches in stocking-stitch. Increase at each end of next and every following 8th row until there are 80 stitches on the needle. Carry on straight until sleeve seam measures 18½ inches.

Here shape top. Cast off 6 stitches at beginning of next 2 rows, then k. 2 tog. at each end of every row until 18 stitches remain. Cast off.

TIE

With No. 12 needles cast on 2 stitches. Work in k. 1, p. 1 rib, increasing at each end of every row until there are 20 stitches on the needle. Continue



straight on these until tie measures 30 inches from commencement, then k. 2 tog. at each end of every row until all stitches are gone.

TO MAKE UP

Press pieces carefully under a damp cloth. Embroider spots on back and front of yoke with navy wool in satin-stitch. Sew together side, shoulder and sleeve seams; insert sleeves. Sew centre 16 inches of collar to neck edges, leaving remainder free to tie.
